

# FAQ Sheet 2026

## Who can come to KidzKamp?

This camp is for kids entering 3<sup>rd</sup> grade through 6<sup>th</sup> grade. Kids entering 7<sup>th</sup> through 9<sup>th</sup> grade may apply for the MiddleSchool Service Team (MST). There is more information on that program below!

## When is KidzKamp this year?

July 6-10, 2026. We'll be ready to receive Campers at 3:00pm on Monday the 6<sup>th</sup>. All meals will be provided up through breakfast on Friday, July 10<sup>th</sup>. Camp clean-up is over before 1:00pm, so lunch will need to be arranged by parents or church groups returning home.

## Where is KidzKamp held?

Camp is held at the Cowboys with a Mission (CWAM) base in Meeteetse WY.

*Highway 120 runs roughly North/South Meeteetse.*

*When you get to the middle of town, turn West (SW on the map) on Park Ave. This is also Highway 290.*

*Drive 3.8 Miles.*

*On your right, you will see an entrance to the CWAM base. The address is 369 Hwy 290.*

## What kinds of activities will there be for the campers?

Crafts, games, a bounce house, chapel (with worship songs and Bible teaching), yummy food, horseback riding, fishing, swimming, canoeing, boating, an interactive missions activity, cabin activities, and a great time! Some activities do depend on weather, safety, and availability. At times, we need to do alternative activities. But, it's always great!

## How much does KidzKamp cost?

The regular cost for campers is \$190.00. The cost for MiddleSchoolers approved for the Service Team is \$120. **There is a \$10 late fee for registrations postmarked after Wednesday, June 17<sup>th</sup>.**

## What are the camp rules and policies?

We're committed to giving the kids the best possible week we can. That means there are a few things we need to ask of them to keep everything running smoothly and safely. *These rules apply both to campers and MSTers!* **Any camper or MSTer who creates problems for others by disobeying these basic rules will be sent home after reasonable warnings and efforts have been made to make things work. Parents may be responsible to get them home.**

- Please do not bring knives of any kind or anything else that could cause injury by accident or be used to harm others.
- All meetings and meals are required. Please participate and pay attention.
- Please listen to Camp Staff and Counselors and respect their directions.
- Treat other campers with kindness! Don't hurt them with words or actions.
- Respect the privacy of others.
- Girls and Boys need to stay out of the areas designated for the opposite sex.
- No roughhousing or pillow fights will be allowed in the tent areas. They can easily be damaged.
- Please, no electronics (Tablets, Video games, Smart Phones, iAnythings, etc.) They are a huge distraction keeping campers from interacting with others and learning about God.
- No PDA - No Pairing, Dating, or boy/girl Affection. Talk about distraction!
- Please put all trash in trash cans - including disposable water bottles.
- Treat all property belonging to CWAM, WAF, staff members, or other campers with care and respect. Please do not damage anything.



## What should my camper bring with them to camp?

We're never sure what the weather might do during camp. It can be very hot, or it can be very wet. So, kids need to be prepared for either. There are also some things we would rather the kids not bring.

Here's a more detailed list of what kids should and should not bring to WAF KidzKamp ...

### **To Bring ...**

#### *Toiletries*

- Bath towel, wash cloth, swim towel
- Comb or hairbrush
- Toothpaste, toothbrush
- Soap (in a plastic bag)
- Shampoo
- Insect repellent
- Sun screen

#### *Clothing for 5 days of wet or dry weather*

- T-shirts, sweatshirts
- Jeans, shorts
- Underwear
- Closed toe shoes and socks
- Water shoes (or old tennis shoes) for river and lake activities (not flip-flops)
- Swim suit (modest, not bikini, cover with T-shirt if necessary)
- Jacket with hood (a hat is a good idea)
- Very warm pajamas or sweats to sleep in (the wind at night can get through the tent walls and make it cold!)

#### *Equipment*

- Sleeping bag, pillow, extra blanket
- Foam Pads or small air mattresses are provided, but they may bring their own or a cot if they prefer
- Flashlight
- Water bottle
- Bible, small notebook, pen
- Life Jacket or innertube (*optional - we have them, but if you have a favorite, bring it!*)
- Spending money for snacks, camp store, and offering (\$20-25 or so. They can bring a little more if they want to buy an extra shirt.)
- Fishing pole and tackle (*if they would like to fish. We may also have some for kids to use.*)
- Make sure everything the kids bring is clearly marked with their name!**

### **To Leave at Home ...**

- ✘ Electronic games
- ✘ iPods, Tablets, LapTops, video games, or anything remotely similar to anything listed
- ✘ Cell/Smart Phones
- ✘ Excess money
- ✘ Valuable personal items
- ✘ Knives or other sharp or hazardous things

## Do Campers get T-Shirts?

Yes. A camp T-Shirt is included in the cost. We do have to place the order fairly early, so we can't guarantee a shirt to kids who sign up late. But, we try to get everybody covered if we can. Shirts from previous years may be available at the Camp Store for a great price!

## What is the MiddleSchool Service Team?

The MiddleSchool Service Team (MST) is an opportunity for kids entering 7<sup>th</sup> -9<sup>th</sup> grade to help us make the camp awesome for the younger campers. They help run the activities. They assist adult staff. They help in the kitchen. They are available for anything the staff needs to keep the camp running well. Yes, they normally get to participate in all the fun activities the younger campers do, but there are times they may need to miss out on something due to work that needs to be done. MSTers come with the understanding that they are coming to serve. Their registration cost is lower because they help make the camp work. They have cabin counselors and special discussion times just for them. They will be sleeping indoors. The MST program is by application. We will only bring a limited number to KidzKamp. Please request an application if you would like one.

## Does KidzKamp need more adult or teen Staff?

We might! If you are interested in coming to camp to help on staff, please contact us. We do have an application process that includes a background check.
